Teaching about cultural humility:

We discussed thinking of culture in a broad way beyond race and nationality to socioeconomic groups, ability/disability, gender and orientation, age, religion, eating styles/preferences, etc.

Chapter 13 in Communicating Nutrition covers this topic and on page 209 is a self-assessment. I will attach other materials from the ancillaries that go with this chapter.

Bri shared an activity with their interns revolving around a guest speaker speaking on the topic of cultural awareness and humility. Prior to the session the interns work in small groups to learn about a population group and then after the speaker they reflect on their biases and what they learned.

We discussed the importance of hearing from others about their lived experiences. I will attempt to share links to a couple of videos we used in a FNCE session in 2021 covering the topic of implicit bias.
